Research Statement

My research topics extend from sustainable finance, public finance and macrofinance in general, to medium-scale dynamic macroeconomic modelling and environmental economics.

In particular, as a Doctoral Student at the SFI, I have been studying the determinants of sovereign debt sustainability in advanced economies, mainly focusing on the impact of transition risk and/or climate risk on fiscal limits, in a framework of involuntary defaults.

I am also a Visiting Researcher at Banque de France, Climate Economics Unit, where I analyse the impact of alternative carbon policy mixes on public finances, in the context of a dynamic general equilibrium model.
